Ideas to Have A Great Class

General preparation outside and inside class

Be prepared and prayed up (think Monday rather than Saturday)

Have needed materials copied ahead of time

Have needed items set aside before class begins

- necessity of an organized supplies shelf

Greet children as they arrive

Offer handshake, hug, or high-five (they are more important than the lesson)

Perhaps play music as they arrive

Start your class on-time

What is the condition of your room? Is it warm and inviting? Colorful?

Show enthusiasm for your students and the teaching material

Think of ways to incorporate creativity and surprises into the classroom

Be less vocal and more visual

Discipline

Children need to know the boundaries even if they will push them a little

- boundaries help them feel secure

Involve children in setting rules and punishments, where appropriate

Post classroom procedures and have the children sign it regularly

Be consistent

The manner in which discipline is carried out is crucial

- role play?

Ideally, discipline should play a positive, building role

Be willing to admit mistakes but don't enter into self condemnation

Think the absolute best of your class – story about the "A" and "B" level classes

What you can do in your class is not about you but about God

- corrective to those who think they are too good and those who think they are not good enough
