I spoke with Richard this morning. We were able to talk a little longer and he has been on the move. He went to the orphanage and here is some updated information:

- ** The children are healthy and happy. They mobbed him and sang for him. They were very excited to see him.
- ** We have 58 children that live full time at the orphanage and 200 that go to school! We are now teaching children up through 8th grade!
- ** He delivered the books from the book drive to the teachers! They were so excited to see the encyclopedias that I sent. The teachers are actually college graduated so they speak English. They were concerned that the books would be just for the younger children. Now they have material for the older ones! The children will not have free access to the books. They were cataloged and put in the library where the students can sign them out under supervision and bring them back. This is how they have handled the Bibles that were gifted last year.
- ** Thanks to some donations, Richard will be buying a cow before he leaves. A man has been keeping his 2 cows on our property so the children have had milk but with our own cows, we won't have to trade for the milk! We also still have our chickens.
- ** Almost forgot this! The situation with the man that died in February after attacking one of our students is resolved as far as our staff is concerned. We are not sure if the investigation is finished but it is as far as our involvement goes. Our staff and school have been cleared! Praise God!
- ** If you would like to still make a donation toward the cow, material for bunk beds or a chicken coop, please send it in ASAP. With our new banking system, Richard should be able to get the money to buy the stuff. We need a chicken coop on the property so the chickens can be there instead of at Pastor Ibrahim's home!

Richard will be traveling to speak and he will get to meet with 42 of our college students next week. He is feeling better but please keep praying for his health, protection and provision.
